Cathedral of St Barbara - UNESCO site

Work on this unique Gothic monument commenced in the late 14th century. The church's interior contains a unique collection of late Gothic and Renaissance murals dating from the 15th century.

Open daily: November-March 10am-4pm / April-October 9am-6pm.

Chapel of Corpus Christi

The ground floor of a Gothic site from the turn of the 14th and 15th century, which was originally designed to an ossuary, counts among the few buildings preserved as a whole from the era of late Gothic. There is a beautiful view out of the terrace.

Open daily: November-February 10am-4pm / March and October 10am-5pm / April-September 9am-5pm.

Jesuit College - GASK

Three-storey Baroque building with transverse wings in the shape of a reversed letter "F" was built in 1667 by Giovanni Domenico Orsi. Gallery of Central Bohemian Region-GASK-institution focused on the fine and visual arts of the 20th and 21th centuries resides there.

Open daily, except Monday: Tuesday - Sunday: 10am - 6pm (20. 5. - 30. 9. 2012 open daily).

Czech Museum of Silver Hradek

This small urban castle, originally in Gothic style, was erected by a royal building master prior to 1420. The building currently serves as the Czech Museum of Silver, visitors can also see the medieval silver mine here.

Open daily, except Monday: April and October 9am-5pm / May, June and September 9am-6pm / July-August 10am-6pm / November 10am-4pm / December-March closed. Last admission 90 min. before closing.

Italian Court

This cultural monument consists of an array of buildings dating back to the turn of the 14th century. There used to be a mint there. It also was a temporary seat of Czech kings at the beginning of the 15th century. King Wenceslas IV had two floors and a chapel built in 1400. His royal palace was directly in the mint.

Open daily: November-February 10am-4pm / March and October 10am-5pm / April-September 9am-6pm. Last admission 30 min. before closing.

Museum "Unveiling the mysterious face of Kutna Hora"

It shows real crimes and filth, instruments for torture and punishment at the time of the silver rush of Kutna Hora and its surroundings. It is located in the cellar of the Italian Court. An acoustic coulisse accompanies the authentic setting.

Church of St John of Nepomuk

The plans for this Baroque church were drawn up by F.M. Kaňka in 1734-1754 and the actual building was carried out by the famous K.I.Dientzenhofer. The front facade is decorated with the statues of St Adalbert and St Procopius.

Stone House

One of the most precious burgher houses from the 15th century in the Czech lands. Currently this richly decorated house serves as a museum. Expositions: "Urban life from 17th to 19th century" and "Lapidary".

Open daily, except Monday: April, October 9am-5pm / May, June and September 9am-6pm / July, August 10am-6pm / November 10am-4pm.

Tyl House

Two permanent expositions are on offer: "Josef Kajetan Tyl" (the author of the lyrics of the Czech national anthem-„Where is my home") and "The underground of Kutna Hora and its exploration".

Church of St James

Its construction started in 1330. Until the half of 17th century it was called „Upper“ due to its construction.

Church of Our Lady „Na Nameti“

The Church was established probably on the spot of former silver-miner´s chapel before the year 1357 and was placed outside the town fortification. The construction was financed by revenues from silver ore.

Sankturin House

Originally Gothic building, reconstructed in the Baroque style, was built at the end of the 13th century. There is a chapel in its tower with beautiful late Gothic gable vaulting decorated with plant motives, polychrome and gold plating. These days the Information center and the Alchemy workshop reside here.

The museum guides you through an alchemist´s workshop where sought scholars seek Philosopher´s stone and transform base metals into gold. You may even discover the infamous Golem.

Ossuary at Sedlec

The small Church of All Saints built in the 14th century is located in Sedlec at a cemetery in the vicinity of the grandiose Cathedral of the Assumption of Our Lady. The Ossuary is decorated entirely with human bones. It is estimated that there might be remains of as many as 40 thousand people here.

Open daily: November-February 9am-4pm / April-September Mo-Sat 8am-6pm, Sun 9am-6pm / October and March 9am-5pm.

Cathedral of the Assumption of Our Lady and St. John the Baptist at Sedlec – UNESCO site

This historic monument once belonged to the Cistercian Order, which founded its first monastery in Bohemia at Sedlec in 1142. Thanks to rich findings of silver ore the Cistercians financed the build of the cathedral, it was completed in 1320. It was rebuilt in 1699-1709 by Jan Blažej Santini-Aichl in Baroque Gothic. It represents the first cathedral-like structure built on Bohemian soil.

Open daily: April-October 9am-5pm (Sunday 11am-5pm)/November-March 10am-4pm (Sunday 11am-4pm).
